

Doncaster







Civic & Cultural Quarter

Doncaster's Civic & Cultural Quarter received over £2.4 million from the European Regional Development Fund, which provided key economic infrastructure works in the first phase of regeneration scheme to develop the area.

Doncaster has received EU funding for other projects, including £10 million for the White Rose Way and £8 million for the Frenchgate Interchange.

Doncaster Town Moor

£1 million of European Structural Funds has been invested in Doncaster's Town Moor Racecourse, home to Britain's oldest Classic, the St Leger Stakes.

The funding was used to support the racecourse's conference and exhibition facilities.



132,200 are employed in Doncaster. That's 132,200 people who are better off because of 28 days leave a year, an 11-hour break between shifts and work-specific health and safety rules.

In Doncaster there are **31,700 part-time workers**, all of whom benefit from an EU entitlement to the same hourly pay as full-time workers and have the same leave entitlements.

There are **61,900 women** employed in total in this area. Thanks to the EU, they have protection from dismissal if pregnant, the right to be paid the same as men for work of equal value, and laws protecting them against discrimination.
